I am blessed to have witnessed the impact your commitment has had on families, friends, and neighbors in our community, and wanted to share with you a story of another friend of Hospice Alliance who shared so much with us...

When Barb became a patient in the Hospice House last summer, she and her family didn't need a tour. They didn't need to hear about the beautiful gardens, the quilts, or even where we keep cookies in the kitchen. Barb's family had been a fixture around Hospice Alliance for a decade and a half.

The family's first direct experience came as daughter Linda's husband finished his battle with pancreatic cancer under our care.

Moved by the level of care and compassion Hospice Alliance staff delivered to the young couple, Barb's husband, 'Fire Suit Phil,' harnessed his automotive passions as a drag racer and enthusiast to organize the Hospice Alliance Car Show and Craft Fair for the benefit of future patients and their families. Phil and Barb, along with Linda and her two brothers led the Car Show benefit. And, the family's tradition continued even after Phil passed.

After more than a decade raising tens of thousands of dollars to ensure there would be care for others in their time of need, Barb shifted gears to directly serve those families as a Hospice Alliance volunteer.



Barb called bingo at assisted living homes on our behalf and gently held the hands of those most vulnerable as a Vigil Volunteer. Devoting hours of her time to those in the Hospice House, Barb was one of us...and her lungs were failing her.

From her bed in Room One, Barb experienced the benefits she and her family had helped to provide—compassionate care from our staff, birds visiting the feeder outside her window - the yellow one was her favorite - the cadence of the water feature just beyond, restful hours with Linda watching old movies, a visit from Lowla the basset hound, and a fully stocked cookie jar in the kitchen.

During each visit, Barb would ask Linda to bring her a fresh-baked cookie from the Hospice House kitchen noting, "just one, Linda...leave some for the others."

- We educated and supported our patients' friends and families who struggled with COVID-19 safety protocols by providing COVID-19 fact sheets, visitor logs and screening forms for our at-home patients.
- We invested in Personal Protective Equipment. Our clinical team has been in full PPE since mid-March, and that will continue well into 2021.

As it has done throughout its forty-year history, Hospice Alliance has risen to the challenges of 2020 to continue to provide best-in-class care for our patients and their families. I am incredibly proud of our staff and humbled by the support of our community, knowing none of this would be possible without our donors!
