

The Basics: Facts About Our Care

Hospice Alliance patients are eligible for our care any time after a physician diagnoses them with a terminal illness and a life expectancy of six months or less. A Compassionate Care Team, which strives to meet each patient's unique needs, consists of:

Registered Nurses manage the patient's care throughout the duration of the illness. Assesses the patient's health status, eliminating distressing symptoms and teaches family caregivers how to care for their loved one as well as ensuring they are confident in doing so.

Certified Nurse Assistants help our patients conserve their time and energy to enjoy the best quality of life possible. They visit regularly, helping to manage the symptoms of the illness.


Medical Director consults with the patient's physician and oversees clinical decisions.

Social Workers are experts in helping our patients and their caregivers cope with the numerous changes - physical and emotional that occur at the onset and progression of serious illness.

Spiritual Counselors specialize in the unique spiritual issues that people face when diagnosed with a terminal illness. Music, Dance Movement, and Aroma therapists focus on the needs of individuals to better connect the mind, body, and spirit.


Volunteers provide respite to families caring for loved ones in their home, companionship to patients, assistance in the Hospice Houses and pick-up and delivery of supplies and equipment to patients.

Grief Counselors offer individual and group counseling to families in our care and community members of all ages who are coping with loss.

Highlights: Hospice Alliance Programs

Hospice Alliance is at the forefront of implementing programs to provide the best quality of care – physically, spiritually and emotionally.

In 2019, we continued our commitment to these important life enriching programs.



The Joint Commission

During the spring, Hospice Alliance voluntarily underwent an evaluation by the Joint Commission to learn if our hospice care and palliative care met the rigorous performance standards in delivering quality, safe care.

We were thrilled to learn that we did in fact meet the standards that are above and beyond the traditional state and federal government standards and officially received The Gold Seal of Approval – an internationally recognized symbol of quality for both hospice and palliative care.

In addition to being accredited in hospice care, Hospice Alliance asked that its smaller Palliative Care program be reviewed as well. The assessment let to Hospice Alliance becoming the first community-based palliative care organization in the state of Wisconsin to receive certification.

The Joint Commission's three-year period endorsement put Hospice Alliance in a select group of 22,000 health care programs world wide. The Joint Commission uses leading health care industry guidelines as well as the input of doctors, nurses and quality and safety experts to review standards and make recommendations for ongoing improvements

Bereavement Event Tailored to Children

In August the Bereavement Department hosted the first of many "Planting Memories" events.

We know that following the loss of a special person, many find it helpful to participate in rituals, traditions and reminiscing. Participating in these active events is just one way to help process the grief that we feel, in order to experience peace and integrate this loss into our lives.

Longtime bereavement events such as "Ring and Remember" and our "Service of Remembrance and Memorial Brick Dedication" are wonderful healing events, but the bereavement team felt we were missing the opportunity to provide something special for children and young adults experiencing loss of grandparents, parents, friends or special neighbors.

"Planting Memories" was a new youth-focused summer event hosted in our Hospice House Garden. It is scheduled annually for the 3rd Thursday in August and welcomes all children in the communities we serve. Families have the opportunity to work on a flower planting project, enjoy refreshments and listen to music. The flower is a symbol of the memories that live on and continue to grow strong. Participants took home their creation as a reminder of their ongoing love.

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
